What a beautiful fall we have had in Grande Prairie! With the sun shining and some leaves still on the trees, it cannot get any better. There are even flowers in many peoples' flower pots.

As we move into October, we encourage the students to dress for the unpredictable weather which may come upon us at this time of the year. Layers, are your friend! In the mornings, when the dew on the ground dampens our footwear and the cool air is crisp, we need to wear a jacket and outdoor shoes. As the sun appears, and the day warms up, a hoodie or light sweater might be best. We do ask our students to demonstrate respect for our school and our custodians by changing their shoes as they enter the school. This ensures our floors remain clean and avoids the wetness which may make our floors unsafe. Students require a clean pair of well-fitting shoes for P.E./Gym class as well. We find when dirt and sand is tracked into the gym, it acts like sandpaper removing the finish which is meant for better traction in class or during sports. Serving on school council can have a direct and positive impact on your child's educational experience. Research shows that student achievement increases when parents/guardians are involved in their child's education.


How do I get involved?
